We have all had to take our first steps. At McAuley we are now preparing for baby steps; small steps that will get us on our feet.

Be assured that we are planning for a Recovery Curriculum which will allow as many students from Y10 and Y12 to attend school as is safely possible taking account of all the necessary measures that we need to take to give parents the confidence to send their children to school.

In ensuring this we will continue to work within the guidance sent from the DFE. (The latest statement below came in on Friday afternoon.)

"From 1 June at the earliest, secondary schools will also be asked to provide some face-to-face support for pupils in year 10 and year 12 facing exams next year to supplement their remote education. We will be working with sector representatives over the coming week to develop models of how this could operate, and this will be published along with further guidance for secondary schools shortly."

We are also working with the Local Authority who issued this statement this afternoon.

SCHOOL RE-OPENING UPDATE

We're working closely with schools across the borough on arrangements around the proposed school re-openings.

It's been agreed by everyone that we will take a Doncasterspecific approach to the situation and do what is best for the children of Doncaster.

Schools will only open when everyone is confident that the relevant plans are in place to ensure the safety of staff, children, young people and families.

The final decision on when and how schools open will ultimately be made by each individual school with the best interests of their staff and pupils in mind. They will continue to update parents of their plans.

Schools continue to offer provision to children of key workers and vulnerable children

We are really looking forward to seeing our young people again. We miss them. The school does feel hollow and soulless without them filling the space with their energy, noise, busyness and laughter.
