Your role in the success of your child is incredibly important and we all need to work together to help our children/students achieve their goals. Our students are challenged in lessons by their teachers on a regular basis to think deeper than their initial answer. In almost all cases, when students move from their initial verbal or written answer and challenge themselves with a higher thinking skill they will more likely be accessing the higher levels of the mark scheme and inevitably receive a strong score.

We would like you to use the same questioning technique at home with your child when you work together and are revising-even when you are not! The more habitual it is to think critically, the more likely it is that the higher levels will be achieved.
