GDPR Privacy Notice 2024/25

General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) - what we do with the information you provide and, if from another school, information that we receive from your previous school(s).

Schools hold student information in order to run the education system to: support teaching and learning, monitor and report progress, provide appropriate pastoral care, assess the quality of its services, comply with the law regarding data sharing and safeguarding and provide statutory services eg assessment for Free School Meals eligibility. In doing so, schools have to collect and use your information in accordance with The Education Act 1996. This means, among other things, that the data held can only be used for specific purposes allowed by law.

We share student data with the Department for Education (DfE) in accordance with The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) Regulations 2013. We do not share information about our students with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

After the age of 13, schools share pupil information with the Local Authority (LA) and/or providers of Youth Support Services such as independent careers advisers and other providers in the event that a student transfers from one provider to another.

A parent/carer can request, by informing us, that **only** their child's name, address and date of birth is passed to their LA or provider of Youth Support Services. This right is transferred to the child at the age of 16.
